Stronger Standards, safer children

Victoria's Child Safe Standards are a set of mandatory requirements to protect children and young people from harm and abuse.

The Child Safe Standards commenced in Victoria in January 2016. Recent changes have been made to make our Standards even stronger. The new Child Safe Standards came into force on 1 July 2022 and organisations including schools are now required to comply with these new Standards.

The new Standards set out minimum requirements and outline the actions organisations must take to keep children and young people safe.

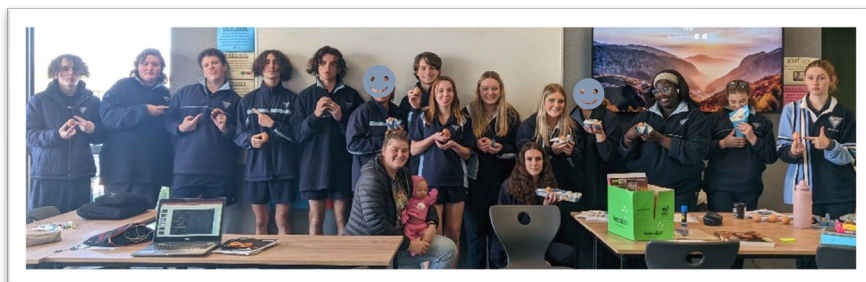
Although similar to Victoria's current Child Safe Standards, key changes include new requirements:

- to involve families and communities in organisations' efforts to keep children and young people safe
- for a greater focus on safety for Aboriginal children and young people
- to manage the risk of child abuse in online environments
- in relation to governance, systems and processes to keep children and young people safe.

To ensure that we as a school are compliant with the new Child Safety Standards we have reviewed our Child Safety Policies. These policies were recently approved by school council and have been updated on our school website. To view these policies visit:

Senior Course selection is an incredibly important process for a student entering their Senior Years of secondary schooling. To support this process we provide information through our senior information evening and ongoing support via subject Teachers, Careers team, Year Level Leaders and Course Counselling.

We would encourage all current year 10 students and their parents/carers to attend our Senior Information Evening, current Year 9 students considering an early start VCE/VM and any students currently enrolled in the intermediate VCAL to also attend.

Participation in Course counselling interviews is required of all current year 10 students to ensure the subjects they select align to their chosen pathway or provide the necessary pre-requisites for their desired University Course. We will provide course counselling to students currently enrolled in the intermediate VCAL to ensure a seamless transition into the VCE Vocational Major (VM). Course counselling is recommended for students who are planning to change their VCE subject selections at the end of year 11 or have changed the University Course they are aiming to access.

Course counselling information will be delivered next week but save the date as course counselling will occur on Monday August 15th and bookings will occur via compass. Current Year 10 students will not have scheduled classes on this date and there will be opportunities to book course counselling interviews to occur outside of normal school hours. We would highly recommend Parents and Carers to attend these course counselling interviews with your children for guidance and support in this very important time of decision making around education futures.


Our middle school students this week participated in a presentation provided by the Pat Cronin foundation. The 'Be Wise' presentation focussed on the devastating impacts of the coward's punch on victims, perpetrators and all families. It was an insightful and well received presentation that had our students reflecting and thinking honestly about the hidden dangers of violence and aggression. Violence towards others is never something to be celebrated, the power of this program was the capacity to show the impact on all involved, no body benefits from a cowards punch and nobody wins when violence becomes the method of resolving conflict.

This will be an opportunity to become informed around senior course selection and ask any questions that you may have around senior course selection.

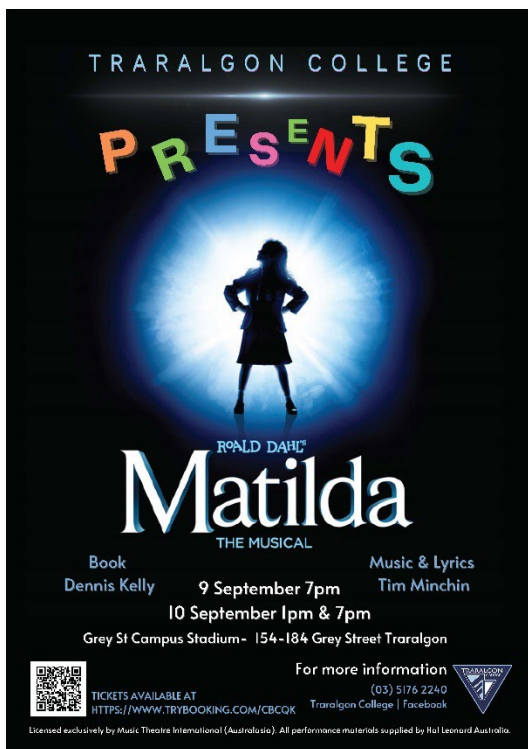
