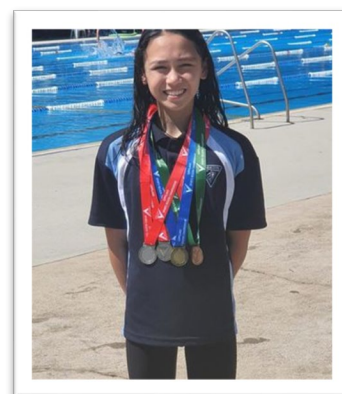

Grey Steet Campus

You have possibly noticed a subtle shift in language that we now refer to our two campuses as Shakespeare Street and Grey Street, in previous incantations they have been referred to as East and West, Junior and Senior. Why the change? As we are undertaking significant regeneration developments on both sites and structural realignment of our middle school years (9 & 10) being on one site with our senior year levels it was important to create a more inclusive brand and alignment to the changes that have occurred.

The year began with a significant organisational change with our year 9's joining the Grey Street campus and other than some issues around congestion in hallways and walkways due to the construction works, these students have settled in very well on their new campus.

Our student Leaders attended a three day Leadership development camp in the first week of this term and they have returned with a raft of initiatives and improved capacity to provide leadership to their peers and we look forward to the outcomes they achieve over the coming terms as they implement their ideas and improvement initiatives through high levels of student consultation, creating voice and agency for all.

Throughout the Covid pandemic our phones have become a necessary item for checking in to retail outlets to access the necessities for living, to prove vaccination status and comply with government legislation, with new settings many of these requirements no longer exist. We have reminded our students of the government rules that were in place prior to remote learning, all phones are to be in lockers switched off by 9am of the school day and cannot be accessed again until the end of the day at 3.13pm. These requirements are once again being implemented by our school staff and we are applying our school mobile phone policy to support compliance with this government legislation. We thank you all for your ongoing support to ensure our college is a safe space for all and that learning is our priority in the classrooms and positive social interactions our priority in all settings.

Shakespeare Street Campus

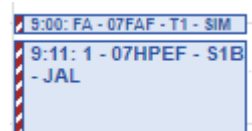
What a fabulous start to term 2 it has been. We commenced the term with a Campus assembly on Tuesday. It was wonderful to have an opportunity to hold an assembly with the easing of restrictions. At the assembly students were reminded of our College Expectations – **In Uniform, In Class, On Time, On Task**. The key messages reinforced included:

In Uniform – All student are expected to be in full school uniform each day. To comply with this student are not permitted to wear hats inside.

In Class, On Time, On Task – All students are to be lined up ready for class with all required materials when the bell rings. Students are expected to maximise time in class, engaging in all learning experiences.

PE Uniform:

Students have practical PE lessons twice per week. As a parent you can access your child's timetable on Compass so that you are aware of days your child has practical PE classes.

Please note: students must change for practical PE classes. The requirements for practical PE classes include:

- Black basketball shorts

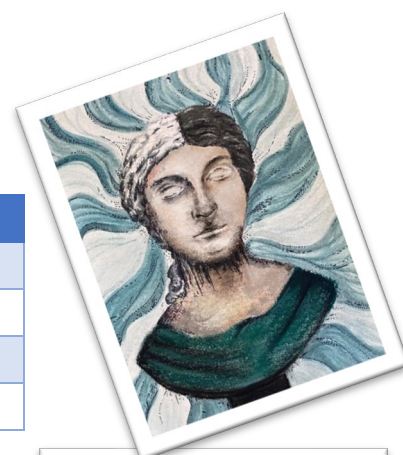
