Last Friday staff participated in professional development exploring strategies they can use in their classes to support high expectations for learning. As a College we have decided to focus on the strategy of 'No Opt Out' in all our classes with this being reinforced by our support staff. 'No Opt Out' is primarily focussed on asking questions in class and having student's respond. If the student doesn't know the answer or doesn't want to answer, there are a series of prompts that can be used to support a student to answer. This support means they can't 'Opt out'.

This evidenced based strategy is directly linked to improved student performance on tasks, increased student confidence in learning and increased feelings of positivity in school. Equally important is for our students to be ready for class, with all their equipment so that they can quickly settle into the learning set for the lesson. If you could check that your child has all the resources they need for class, it would be appreciated. Reach out to your child's teachers or form teacher if you have any questions about this strategy or what else you can do to assist them to 'opt in' to learning

INTERSCHOOL SPORTS


