Principal's News

Welcome back to Term 3. This term is always incredibly busy as Senior Students prepare for final assessments and the students coming through participate in the selection process for Year 10 and Year 11 subjects. In 2023 the Victorian Seniors Years reform will see changes to VCE and Vocational Education for Victorian Students. Our College will be providing students and families with the details of these changes at our VCE Information evening. (Please see important dates and Grey Street Campus section of this and future newsletters for ongoing details about the changes.)

We have started the Term in a more stable position with our staffing, however we are still experiencing workforce challenges due to staff illness. Grey Steet Campus

Throughout 2022 our Senior Teams and Curriculum Executive have been and still continue to be engaged with planning for Senior Secondary Reforms being introduced by the Victorian Curriculum Assessment Authority (VCAA). These reforms will be implemented in 2023 and will impact upon current VCAL students. Essentially the Senior School Reforms will provide a greater diversity of VET offerings and create a new pathway in the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE). The new pathway is the Vocational Major Pathway and holds similarities and differences to the Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (VCAL). The VCAL will no longer exist beyond 2022, but all students currently in this pathway will receive unit credits towards their Vocational Major VCE. This information is obviously complex and requires significantly more explanation than can be offered in this bulletin. There will be a Senior Information evening held at the Traralgon College VCE centre during week 5. Please put August 9th on your Calendar, the Senior Information Evening will provide important information around Senior School Reforms and offer opportunities to engage with staff ask questions and also engage with local industry and VET providers to support pathway planning.

The information evening will offer information about all VCE offerings for 2023, not just the Vocational Major. All year 10 students will be expected to participate in course counselling that will occur on Monday August 15th, parents need to attend to support this process and the resulting decisions that occur around course selection. There will be opportunities to book course counselling during the day or into the evening to support work commitments. On this day there will be no classes for year 10 students, the course counselling process occurs in Lieu of classes. A typical course counselling interview lasts for 15 to 30 minutes and makes sure that a student's course selection aligns to their desired career or education pathway. Students who are currently enrolled in VCAL and need clarification around the transition to Vocational Major or are in year 9 and considering and early start VCE or Vocational Major are encouraged to attend the senior information evening and book a course counselling interview.

Details on how to book Course Counselling Interviews will be released in coming weeks, full details of the Senior Information Evening will be released next week.

From the last week of Term 2 through the school holidays, Grey Street Campus teacher Stephen Jeffs has been in Broome, Western Australia. He is currently completing a university course in Aboriginal Studies and was spending time on Country, and attending lectures. As part of his course he completed a short assignment of 1000 words, looking into the Aboriginal history of Gippsland. As the final week of the holidays was NAIDOC week, a copy of his essay has been <u>here</u> to continue to break the 'silent history' around the period of colonisation in Australia.

Year Levels Leaders not only respond to individual student behaviour with timely interventions and disciplinary outcomes they also support the development and implementation of Behaviour Support Plans, Individual Education Plans, Safety Plans and Attendance Improvement Plans. They also contribute to maximising school life through organising year level camps, excursions, incursions, campus celebrations and activities. This term we will continue to focus on having high expectations to for all students. This includes high expectations for learning, behaviour and attendance. As a parent/carer you can support this in a range of ways. This includes ensuring your child attends school each day (when well), supporting your child to establish a routine for charging their laptop each night, making certain your child has the resources they need for each class and making sure your child is in full school uniform each day.

Careers News

In week 9 of Term 2 over 90 year 10 students took part in work experience in a variety of sectors and work places including: Childcare centres, Primary Schools, Accounting firms, Builders, Electricians, Dentist, Hairdressers, Veterinarian Surgeries, etc.

Work experience has given these year 10 students the opportunity to develop employability skills, explore possible careers options, understand employer expectations and increase their self-understanding, maturity, independence and self-confidence.

The Traralgon College Careers Team would like to extend their gratitude and appreciation to the businesses and host employers that provided these wonderful opportunities this week for growth and development to our year 10 students.





For those students in year 10 who did not do work experience the Careers Team ran a Careers Pathway Program throughout the whole of week 9. The Careers Pathway Program was a great program for students who were unsure about future career pathways, were unable to do work experience in their chosen career path due to COVID regulations or workplaces not being able to take them onboard, wanted to learn more about different industries, further education, etc.

During this week these students took part in workshops and presentations at School and many external excursions and Industry tours. On the Monday they went to Latrobe Valley Bus Line Traralgon Depot for a tour of the site and saw firsthand what is involved with the maintenance of the large fleet of buses, they even got to sit behind the wheel of a Bus. On Tuesday they went out to SafeTech in Moe for a tour of their Facilities as SafeTech are Australia's leading designer and manufacturer of dock products, freight hoists, scissor lifts, pallet loading and handling equipment, stretch wrappers, cranes, hoists and vehicle lifts. On Wednesday they spent the whole day out at Federation University Churchill Campus listening to presentations from Lecturers, took part in a tour of the campus and did some hands on practical in the Nursing labs learning how to take blood from a fake arm, taking blood pressure, etc. On Friday they spent the morning undertaking an interactive program at Latrobe Youth Space which involved baking scones and cheese toasties for morning tea, creating some art work, utilising the games facilities there and finding out more about all the programs they can undertake themselves for free that are run at the Latrobe Valley Youth Space.
