The information presented addressed the Senior Secondary reform and new course offerings of VCE Vocational Major and Victorian Pathways Certificate that are replacing the VCAL program in 2023.

Course counselling will occur for all year 10 students on Monday August 15<sup>th</sup> at the college and on this day classes will not run for year 10 students. Year 10 students are only required to attend for their course counselling interview and our preference is that they have a parent/carer present. You can book course counselling by going to the people icon on compass and selecting conferences to access course counselling bookings. You will be prompted to select your child's desired pathway, VCE, VM (VCE Vocational Major), VPC (Vocational Pathways Certificate) or undecided, this will ensure you are matched up to an appropriate level of expertise within the college to finalise
